COVID-19 Was The Leading Cause of Death for Police in 2021

Some 458 federal, state, tribal and local law enforcement officers died in the line-of-duty in 2021, according to preliminary data compiled by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund (NLEOMF). This is an increase of fifty five percent from the 295 officers killed during the same period last year, and is the highest total line-of-duty officer deaths since 1930, when there were 312 fatalities.


