What Are Predictors and Consequences of School Violence?

A recent study offers one of the most comprehensive reviews of school violence research to date, helping identify several important implications for strategies to reduce school violence and suggestions for future research.

The study sheds light on which factors are strongly or weakly associated with school violence, which are linked with school violence perpetration versus victimization, and which to target to reduce school violence.

A new article summarizes the study, listing out the findings of predictors and consequences of school violence perpetration and victimization, as well as how students are more likely to be victims.

Statistical Briefing Book Updates Data Snapshot on Teen Dating Violence

OJJDP has updated its [Statistical Briefing Book](#) with a new [Data Snapshot](#) on teen dating violence. The snapshot draws on data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s [Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System](#) to document the trends and characteristics of exposure to dating violence reported by high school students. The data show

the prevalence of physical and sexual dating violence reported by students declined overall between 2013 and 2019. Developed for OJJDP by the [National Center for Juvenile Justice](#), the research division of the [National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges](#), the Statistical Briefing Book offers easy online access to statistics on a variety of juvenile justice topics.

A new report by the AIC examines the circumstances leading to intimate partner femicide from the perspective of friends and family.

- While many intimate partner femicide victims experienced previous physical violence at the hands of their partners, victims and their loved ones may not acknowledge such behaviours as 'abuse'.
- All victims included in the study experienced coercive control during their relationship and most were in the process of attempting to regain some level of autonomy at the time of their deaths.

The Australian Institute of Criminology's latest statistics from the National Homicide Monitoring Program show that:

- There were 261 homicide incidents recorded in Australia between 1 July 2019 and 30 June 2020, an increase of 35 incidents from the previous year. There were 278 victims of homicide and 314 identified homicide offenders in this period.
- The domestic homicide incident rate was 0.32 per 100,000 in 2019–20, as was the acquaintance homicide rate. The stranger homicide rate was 0.18 per 100,000.
- There were 45 intimate partner homicides in 2019–20, including 36 of women and nine of men. The female intimate partner homicide victimisation rate was 0.35 per 100,000, the same as the previous year.

The Department of Justice unsealed two indictments today charging four defendants, all Russian nationals who worked for the Russian government, with attempting, supporting and conducting computer intrusions that together, in two separate conspiracies, targeted the global energy sector between 2012 and 2018. In total, these hacking campaigns targeted thousands of computers, at hundreds of companies and organizations, in approximately 135 countries.

This report presents data on defendants who were released or detained pretrial by federal district courts, including the type of release or detention and whether defendants were returned to custody for misconduct during their release. It examines defendant characteristics, the method by which defendants were released, differences in pretrial releases by the defendant's offense and criminal history, and differences in misconduct by the defendant's criminal history and type of release. Findings are based on Probation and Pretrial Services data provided to BJS's [Federal Justice Statistics Program](#), which BJS has conducted annually since 1979.

What is Situational Crime Prevention?

Situational crime prevention is a crime reduction strategy used by law enforcement that stemmed from the analysis of circumstances that give rise to particular types of crime. The strategy posits that criminal acts may be deterred by strategic environmental or managerial changes. It differs from other crime prevention strategies because it focuses on the setting for crime, rather than those committing criminal acts. The main goal of situational crime prevention is to make criminal acts less attractive to people who might potentially offend.

There are a multitude of ways this can be accomplished, including increasing the risk and reducing the reward of committing a crime, removing the target, increasing surveillance, controlling weapons, and alerting the offending person's conscience. As such, it requires assistance from the leadership at a number of public and private locations that tend to attract crime, including schools, hospitals, parks, bars, stores, and transit.
