On September 27, 2023, the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) will recognize the 50th anniversary of the **National Crime Victimization Survey** (NCVS). [Join us](#) in person or virtually for a morning session in the Great Hall at the U.S. Department of Justice and an afternoon session in the Main Conference Room at the Bureau of Justice Statistics, Office of Justice Programs. Panelists and speakers will include selected federal leaders, nationally recognized criminal justice researchers, practitioner leaders, and NCVS subject matter experts.

The morning session will focus on the importance of the NCVS in informing criminal justice policies; the relevance of the NCVS in the federal statistical system; research using the NCVS; and the past, present, and future use of the survey. The afternoon session will focus on innovations to the NCVS over the decades; what we have learned from the survey on crime and victimization; and the outcome of research using the NCVS on critical topics, such as reporting to police, domestic violence, identity theft, and hate crime.

Celebrating this milestone affirms BJS’s continuing commitment to providing reliable statistics on crime and victimization to inform policies and programs to combat crime, support victims, and reform and strengthen the criminal and juvenile justice system.

Webinar Summary:

Behavioral health and social service needs are common in most arrest populations. For most individuals, these needs will not interfere with making court appearances and remaining arrest-free before trial. However, for some, needs can escalate into a heightened risk of pretrial misconduct. This webinar will address the complexity of managing substance use disorder—a prevalent need in most arrest populations—and suggests a “pretrial intervention services” model that outlines when 1) pretrial agencies should consider services; 2) when services should be integrated into supervision support; and 3) what treatment service strategies are best at the pretrial stage.

This webinar is part two of a three-part pretrial webinar series and introduces NIC’s new publication ***Incorporating Services and Support into Pretrial Supervision: IS There a Best Model?*** [Click here to view or download](#)

To further encourage and promote success, pretrial services agencies are rethinking how to interact with individuals under supervision by incorporating supportive and behavioral health services into their supervision practices. When taking this approach, the question becomes: “Should these services be integrated into pretrial supervision support or supplemental to pretrial supervision support strategies?”

It is our pleasure to invite you to the *XIII Annual Conference of the Victimology Society of Serbia* entitled *Victim Support and Victimisation Prevention: Challenges and Perspectives*, which will be held on *23rd and 24th November 2023 in Belgrade*, Hotel Palace, Topličin venac 23.

The conference aims to bring together experts and researchers, who deal both theoretically and practically and from the perspective of different disciplines with victims' rights and provide assistance to victims of crime, human rights' violations and other forms of suffering, and enable comprehensive exchange of experience and knowledge.

Within the main conference topic, special attention will be devoted to the analysis of challenges and perspectives regarding *victim support*, on the one hand, and *prevention of victimization*, on the other, as well as to their mutual connection and importance of timely, adequate and needs-based victim support for the prevention of re-victimization, re-traumatization and secondary victimization. Bearing in mind the current social context, these topics will be also analysed in the context of the suffering of a large number of victims in two mass murders that shook Serbia in May this year, with the aim of arriving at ideas about adequate forms of assistance to victims and developing effective strategies for the prevention of victimizations.

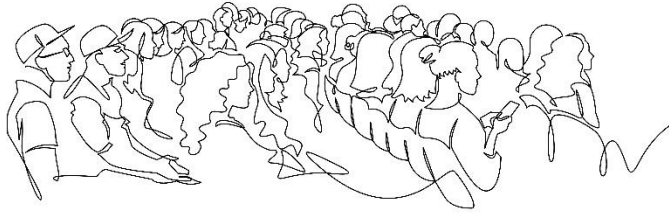

Scottish International Policing Conference & Postgraduate Symposium

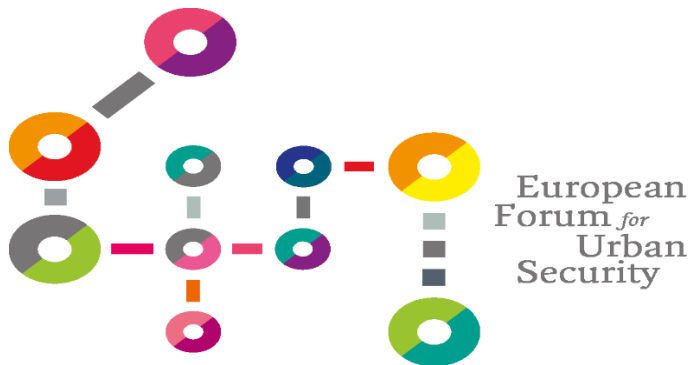
