Introduction

Stalking remains highly prevalent in society, yet little is currently known about the profile of stalking cases within prisons. Despite this gap in knowledge, many individuals stalk from prison and reoffend shortly after release thereby highlighting the need for further research and changes to practice.

This special issue broadly aims to showcase the role of forensic psychology in investigating the nuances of stalking cases held in custody. More specifically, it will draw together key themes related to this sample profile of stalking cases. Research in this area has important implications for the effective treatment and management of stalking cases within prisons including the identification of early interventions to address offending behaviour. We therefore welcome submissions of both quantitative and qualitative studies on this topic that use a variety of methods and design approaches.
