The Jerry Lee Lecture

This year's Jerry Lee Lecture will be given by **Professor Alex R. Piquero** of the Department of Sociology & Criminology and Arts & Sciences Distinguished Scholar at the University of Miami. His presentation "But first there was citrus fruit, a naval ship, and scurvy: Successes and challenges using scientific research to inform criminal justice policy decisions" will be held on Wednesday, June 12 at 11:00.

Most recently, Dr. Piquero served as the Director of the Bureau of Justice Statistics, one of the nation's thirteen federal statistical agencies (appointed by President Biden, June 2022). During his

Directorship of BJS, he oversaw a budget of over \$90 million dollars, including several dozens of data collections on various crime and justice topics including police-citizen contacts, and worked hand-hand with a dedicated team of over fifty persons. He started several new data collections, initiated new publication mediums, engaged in several inter-agency collaborations, elevated and promoted exceptionally qualified women and persons of color to leadership positions, spoke at the White House on the importance of Hispanic educational excellence, and co-wrote a report to President Biden on criminal justice and policing statistics about the importance of disaggregated data.
