It provides the most comprehensive view of how many people are locked up in the U.S., in what kinds of facilities, and why. The U.S. has the highest incarceration rate of any independent democracy on earth — worse, every single state incarcerates more people per capita than most nations. In the global context, even “progressive” U.S. states like New York and Massachusetts appear as extreme as Louisiana and Mississippi in their use of prisons and jails.

Our report examines the incarceration rates of every U.S. state and territory alongside those of the other nations of the world. Looking at each state in the global context reveals that, in every part of the country, incarceration is out of step with the rest of the world.

**Decline In Murders, Other Violent Crimes Likely to Level Off In 2025**

The national decline in murders probably will level off in 2025, predicts New Orleans-based crime statistics analyst Jeff Asher on Substack. Murder fell at the fastest pace ever recorded in 2023 and it fell even faster in 2024, but there is evidence that some places with large declines over that span are starting to see things level off.

**Baltimore Homicides Down, Mayor Credits Gun Violence Strategy**

Two hundred people have been killed in Baltimore this year, the Baltimore Police Department says. That represents a 23% decrease from the number of homicides, 259, on the same date last year. It corresponds with a decline in nonfatal shootings. There have been 413 nonfatal shootings in 2024 as of Monday, compared to 627 by the same time last year.

BJS has released *Human Trafficking Incidents Reported by Law Enforcement, 2022 – Statistical Tables*. This report analyzes the types of human trafficking (labor trafficking and sex trafficking) that occurred in 2022 and provides statistics on the number of incidents and victimizations by type, with breakdowns by sex, age, race, location, and weapon type. It also includes statistics that show incident clearance types, numbers of offenders per incident, numbers of victims per incident, and the relationship of alleged offenders to victims. Findings are based on crime known to law enforcement that was reported to the FBI via the National Incident-Based Reporting System.

## **Access the Juvenile Court Statistics 2022 Report**

The [National Center for Juvenile Justice](#) has released "[Juvenile Court Statistics 2022](#)." This report describes delinquency and petitioned status offense cases handled in U.S. courts with jurisdiction over juvenile populations between 2005 and 2022.



Characteristics are presented on an estimated 549,500 delinquency cases and 62,000 petitioned status offense cases handled in 2022. The report also tracks caseload trends from 2005 to 2022. Data include case counts and rates, juvenile demographics, and offenses charged.

Key findings include: In 2022, juvenile courts handled about 1,500 delinquency cases per day. Though delinquency caseloads increased in 2022, the number of cases was below pre-pandemic levels for all offenses. This report draws on data from the National Juvenile Court Data Archive, funded by OJJDP and managed by the National Institute of Justice.

**Coordinating Council Releases Two New Reports to Congress**

The [Coordinating Council on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention](#) (Council) has released two new reports to Congress representing input from multiple federal agencies and practitioners in the field:

- [Report to Congress and The White House Fiscal Year 2023-2024](#). This report issues recommendations in support of a federal response to justice-involved youth. It is based on nearly two years of work by the Council listening to youth and families with lived experience, hearing from juvenile justice stakeholders, sharing information across Federal agencies, and visiting jurisdictions to see best practices in action. These recommendations



and action plan are grounded in the [Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act](#) and focus on OJJDP's [Continuum of Care for Communities framework](#).

- [Independent Practitioner Report on Youth Justice](#). This report by Council practitioners complements the full report of the Council by underscoring where additional opportunities may exist to meet critical needs of youth and families in their communities.

The number of murders across the U.S. declined sharply for much of 2024, continuing a downward trend, according to data collected by the FBI, cities and independent researchers. Murders spiked during the pandemic, and crime became a central focus of President-elect Trump's campaign message. Polls show Americans still see it as a major problem.

## **Chicago May End the Year With Fewer Than 600 Homicides**

Despite recording more than 570 homicides in 2024, Chicago saw signs of improvement, with that total marking the third consecutive year the city recorded fewer killings than the one prior. This was the first year since the COVID-19 pandemic that the city had fewer than 600 slayings before the turn of the calendar. +++++

This week, President Biden made a historic move by **commuting the sentences** of most of the people currently on federal death row to life imprisonment without parole. The decision is an important acknowledgment of the deep flaws in the death penalty system, which is plagued by racial and geographic disparities. It also comes at a crucial moment, as President-elect Trump has vowed to increase federal executions upon his return to office despite growing concerns over the fairness and humanity of capital punishment. Earlier this month, Biden **commuted the sentences** of 1,500 people on home confinement and pardoned dozens convicted of nonviolent crimes.
